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CHILDREN—Only one child under five years of age may travel free with each parent, or each guardian over 17 years of age. Each child under 17 years of age will be charged the fare for children 5 years of age and under 12. However, when one or more children under 5 years of age occupy exclusively a full car seat, one half-fare rail ticket, in addition to the full seat charge, is required. When one or more children under 5 years of age occupy exclusively a Metrocoach seat, a small additional charge will be made. One half-fare is charged for children 5 years of age and under 12.
