Adjustment of Fares—Should any misunderstanding arise with conductors or agents as to the proper fare or ticket privileges, please pay fare requested, take receipt and communicate with Manager, Passenger Service Bureau, Pennsylvania Station (30th Street), Philadelphia, Pa. 19104.

Children—Under five years of age travel free when accompanied by parent or guardian except when one or more children under 5 years of age occupy a seat in parlor or sleeping car one-half (½) rail fare applies in addition to the full seat charge; half fare is charged children 5 years of age and under 12; all persons 12 years and over pay adult fare.

Parlor Cars—All parlor car service on the Pennsylvania Railroad, both local and interline, is operated by the Pennsylvania Railroad.

Responsibility—The Pennsylvania Railroad is not responsible for errors in time tables, nor for inconvenience or damage resulting from delayed trains or failure to make connections, or for shortage of equipment. The schedules and equipment shown in this time table are subject to change without notice.
