Information

The Time from 12.01 A. M. to 12 o'clock, noon, inclusive, is indicated by light-face type; from 12.01 P. M. to 12 o'clock, midnight, inclusive, by dark-face type.

Air-Conditioned Trains—Air-conditioned equipment has been assigned to regular sections of certain trains. Every effort will be made to provide this equipment but the right is reserved to employ non-air-conditioned cars in such trains as may be necessitated by volume of traffic or operating contingencies.

Parlor Cars—All parlor car service, both local and interline, is operated by the Pennsylvania Railroad.

Adjustment of Fares—Should any question arise as to the proper fare or ticket privileges, please pay fare requested, obtain receipt and communicate with Chief of Tariff & Redemption Bureau, Pennsylvania Station—30th St., Philadelphia 4, Pa.

Children—Under 5 years of age travel free when accompanied by parent or guardian; half fare is charged children 5 years of age and under 12; all persons 12 and over pay full fare.

Responsibility—The Pennsylvania Railroad is not responsible for errors in time tables, nor for inconvenience or damage resulting from delayed trains or failure to make connections, or for shortage of equipment. The schedules and equipment shown in this time table are subject to change without notice.

Forwarding of Baggage—Passengers are urged to check baggage in advance so that it may be forwarded on a preceding train. Every effort will be made to facilitate the handling of baggage, but the Railroad can not guarantee to forward on same train with owner, nor the arrival time at destination.

Baggage Allowance—One hundred and fifty (150) pounds of baggage not exceeding one hundred (\$100.00) dollars in value for each adult passenger, and seventy-five (75) pounds not exceeding fifty (\$50.00) dollars in value for each child traveling on a one-half fare ticket will be transported in baggage cars without additional charge, except for a nominal baggage checking service charge of 25¢ per piece of hand baggage and 50¢ per trunk.

A charge is made for weight in excess of the above amounts. Passengers also have the privilege of declaring excess value on their baggage at a charge of twenty-five cents for each additional \$100.00 or fraction thereof over that allowed on their tickets. The valuation declared by one passenger may not exceed \$2,500.00.

Baggage—Weight and Liability—No single piece of baggage exceeding 300 pounds in weight or single shipment exceeding \$2,500.00 in value, will be checked. Free allowance and liability is subject to tariff stipulation as to contents, weight and value.

Storage—A charge is made for storage of baggage left at railroad stations longer than the free time limit.

Meeting Friends—Because Pennsylvania Railroad trains are sometimes operated in more than one section, it will be helpful to friends who plan to meet you to know the number or designation of the Pullman car or coach in which you have your reservation.

At the larger stations, a convenient central point to meet is the Information Bureau.
